²12-Month Dividend Yield: The yield an investor would have received if they had held the fund over the last twelve months assuming the most recent NAV. The 12-Month yield is

calculated by summing any income distributions over the past twelve months and dividing by the NAV.

30-Day SEC Yield: A standard yield calculation developed by the Securities and Exchange Commission that allows for fairer comparisons among funds. This figure reflects the interest earned during the period after deducting the fund's expenses for the period.
